



Double Olympic silver medallist Yohan Blake has pledged to continue supporting the residents and staff at the Mount Olivet Boys' Home in Walderston, Manchester.

She explained that the agency was able to link with Blake through the Joseph's department store, which has been a key sponsor of the agency's efforts at Mount Olivet.

Yohan, with his management team, visited the Mount Olivet Boy's Home with us and gave the boys gifts. They were just so excited to have met this athletic star,” Mrs. Rowe said.
